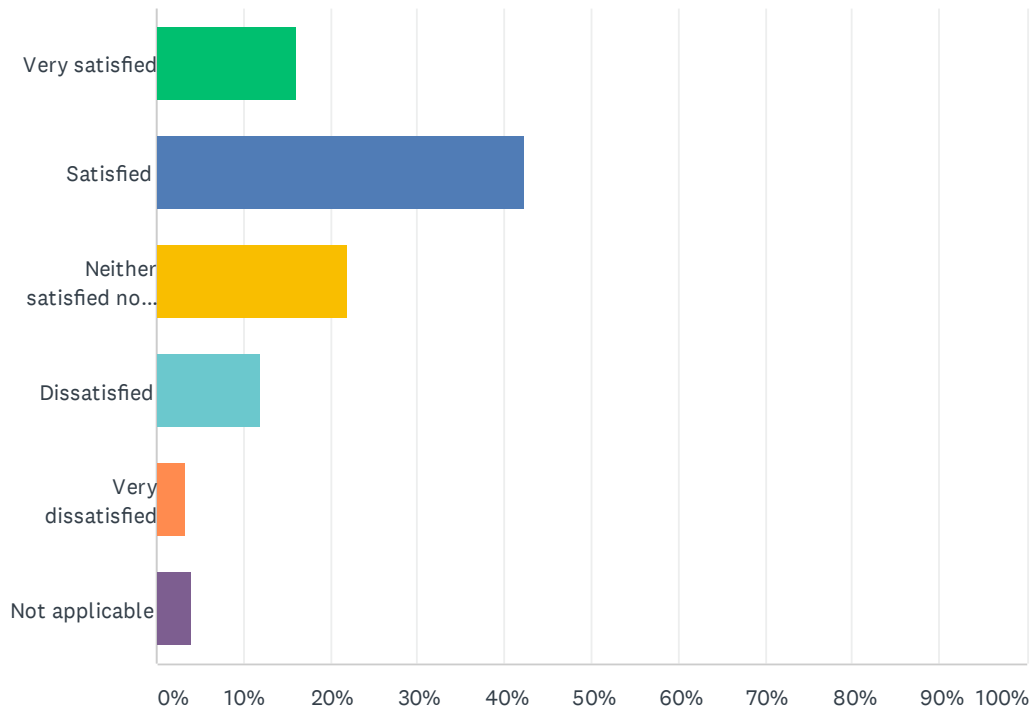


## Q22 How satisfied are you with how the the move to remote teaching and learning was managed within your school?

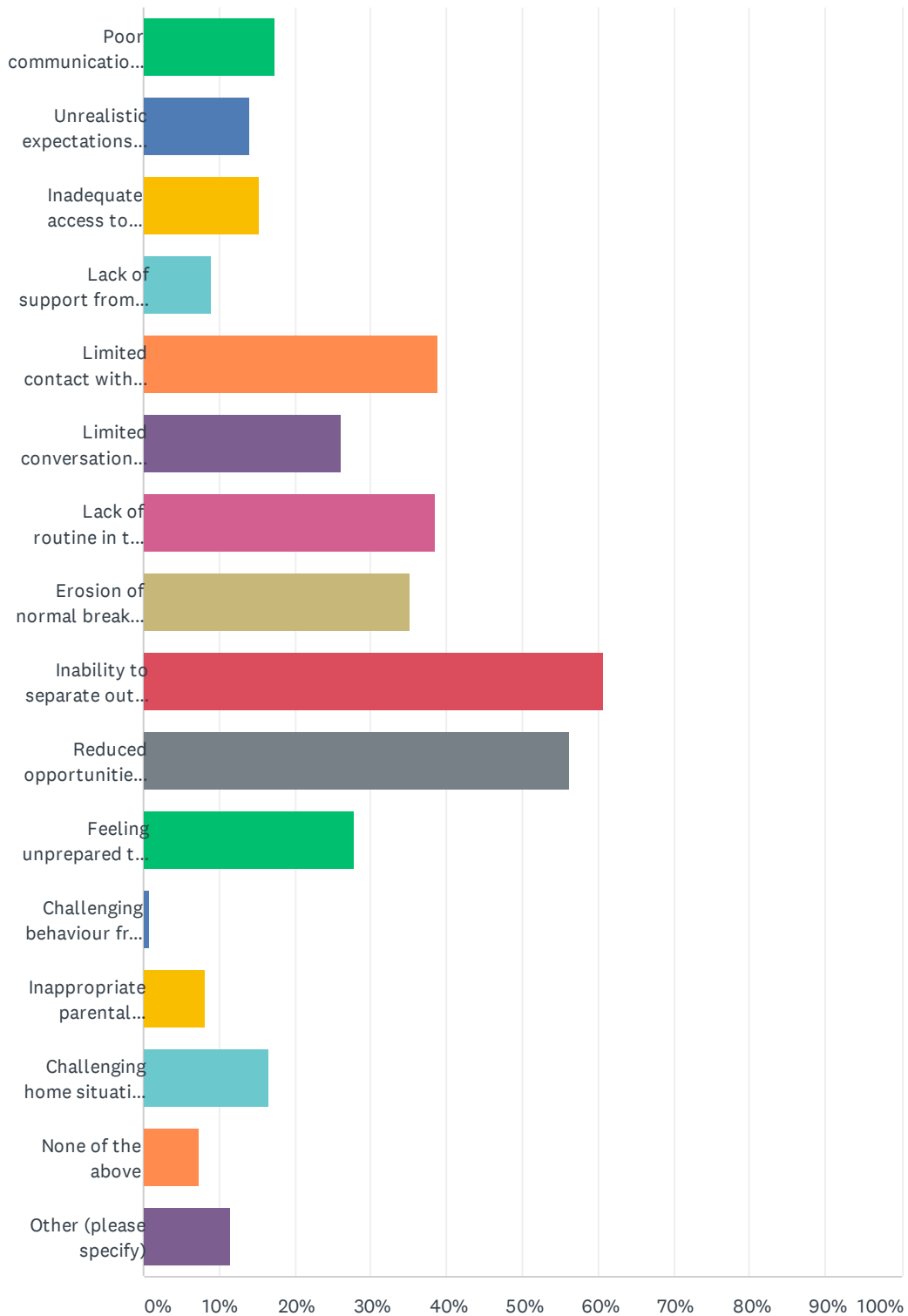

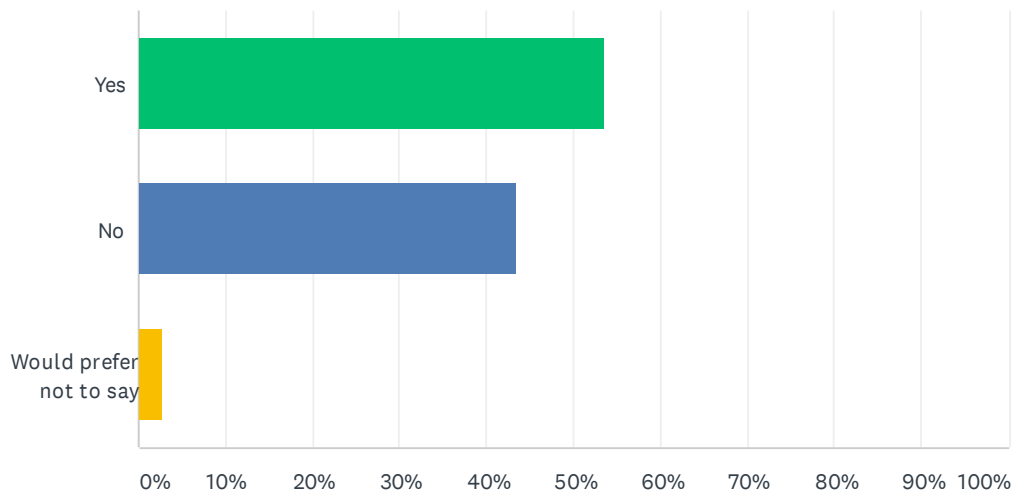

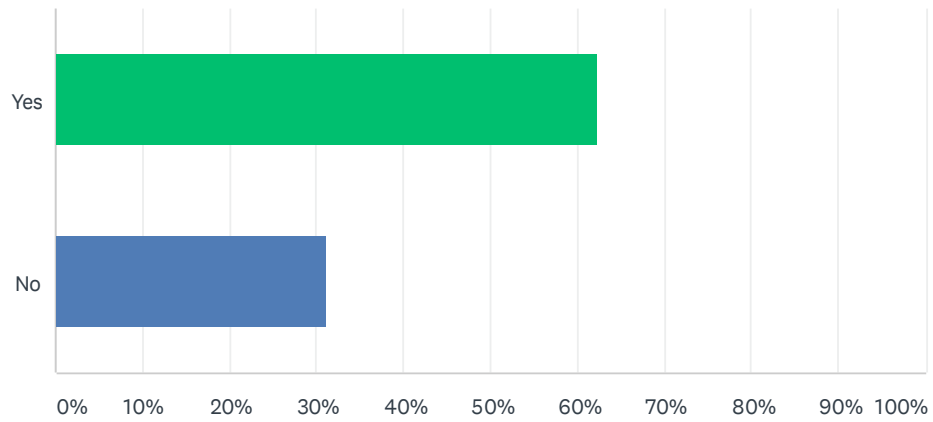

### Q26 If yes, do you think you have been given adequate support from your employer to help you?

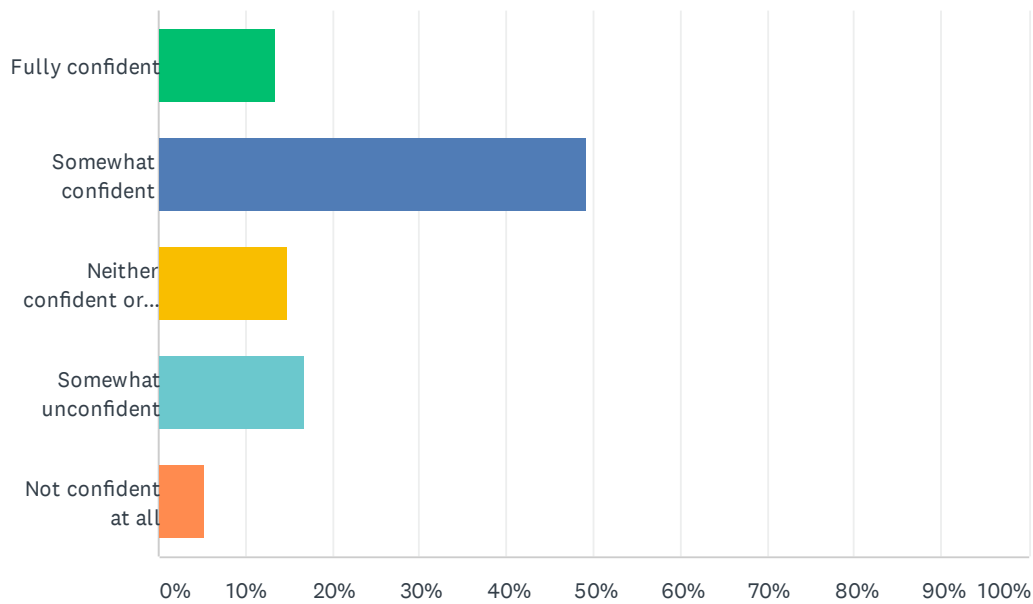

## Q27 What level of confidence do you have in your ability to cope with an increased use of online learning in the next academic year?

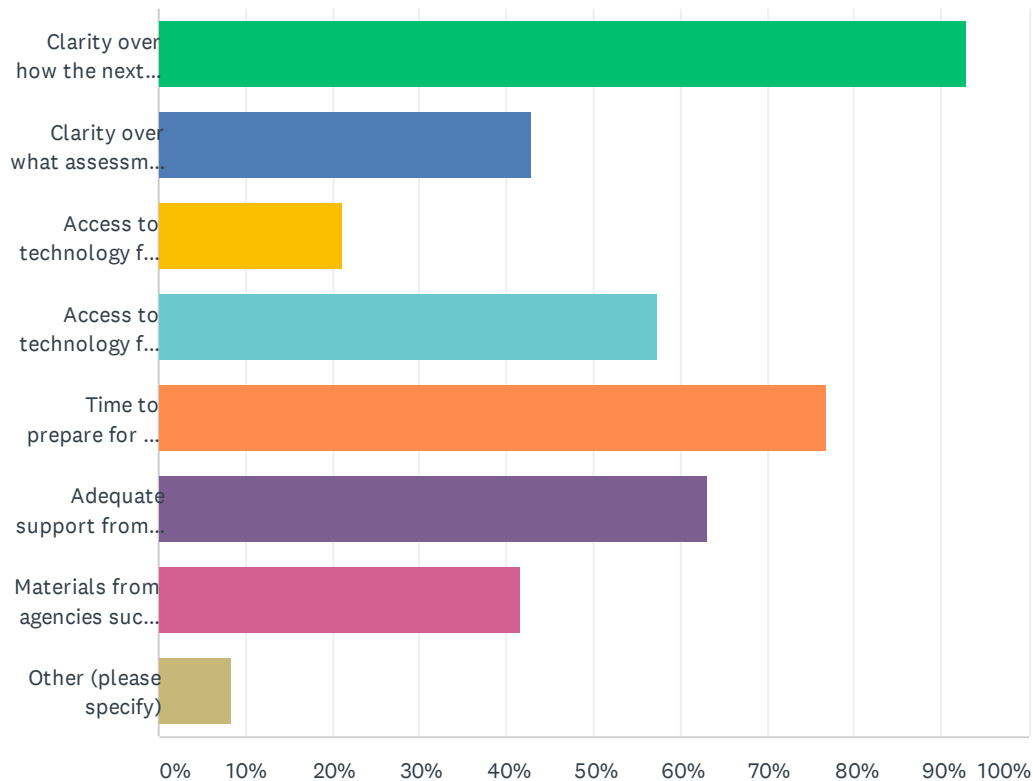

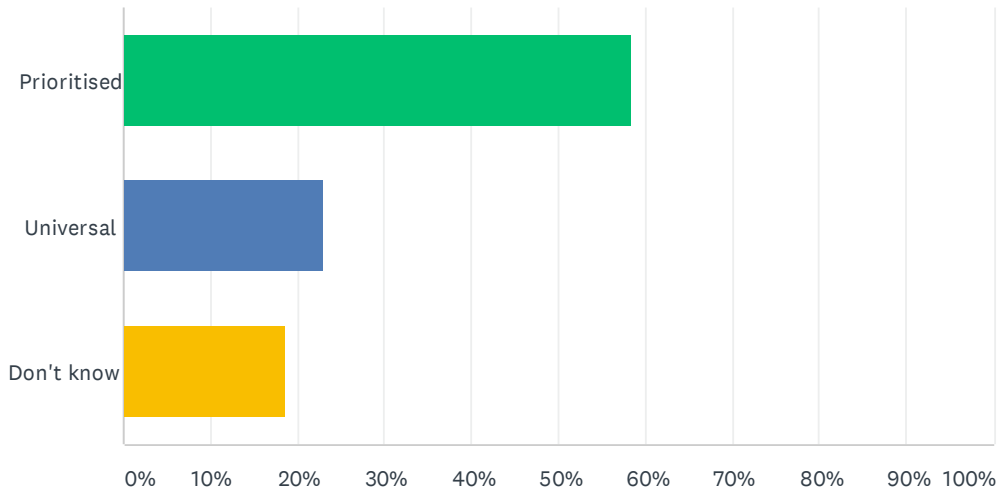

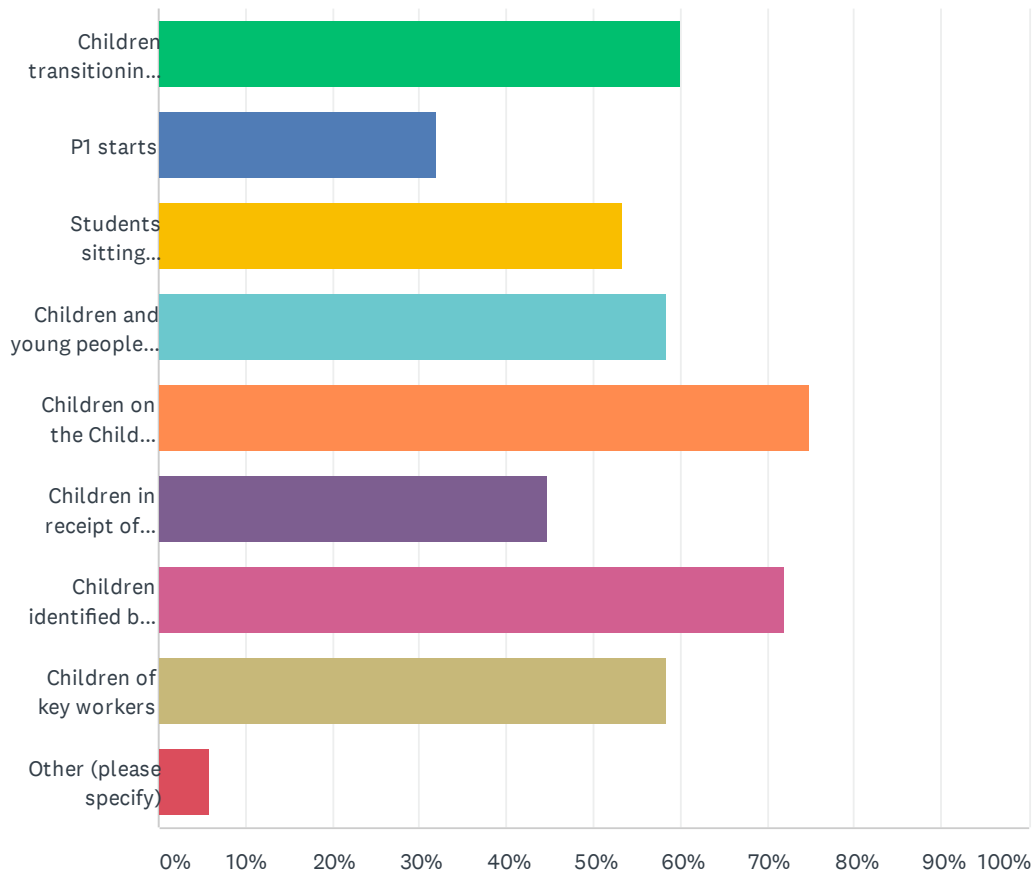

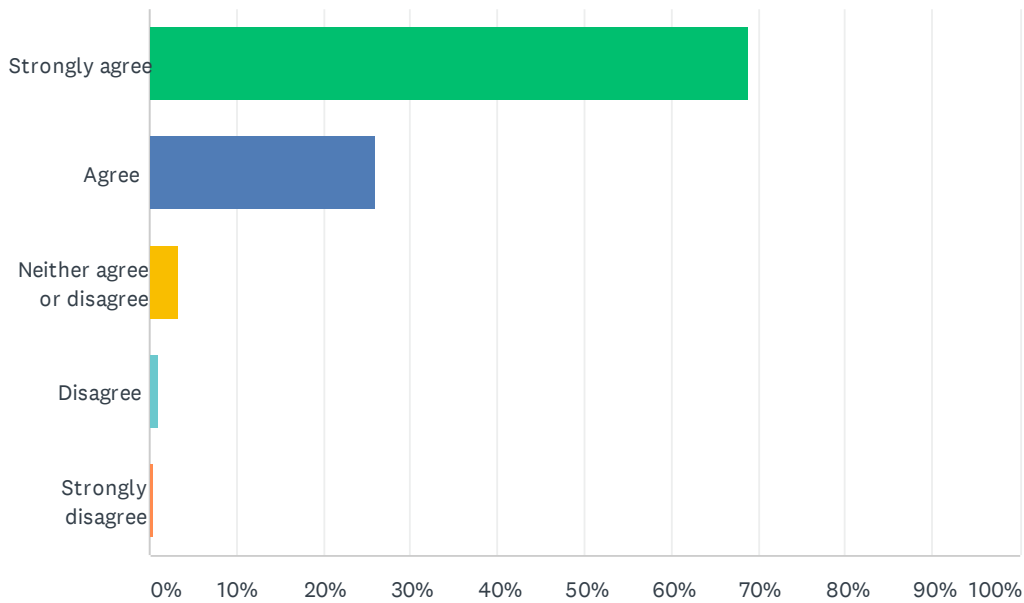

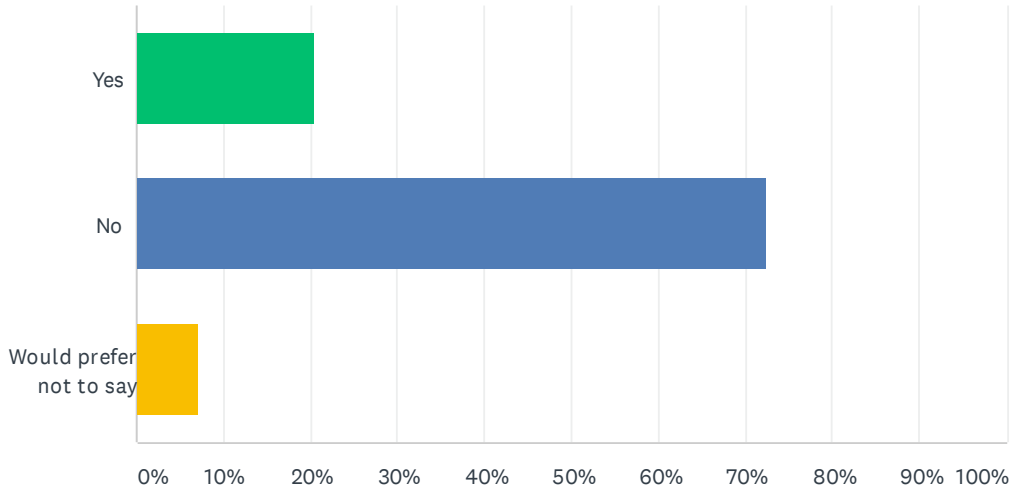

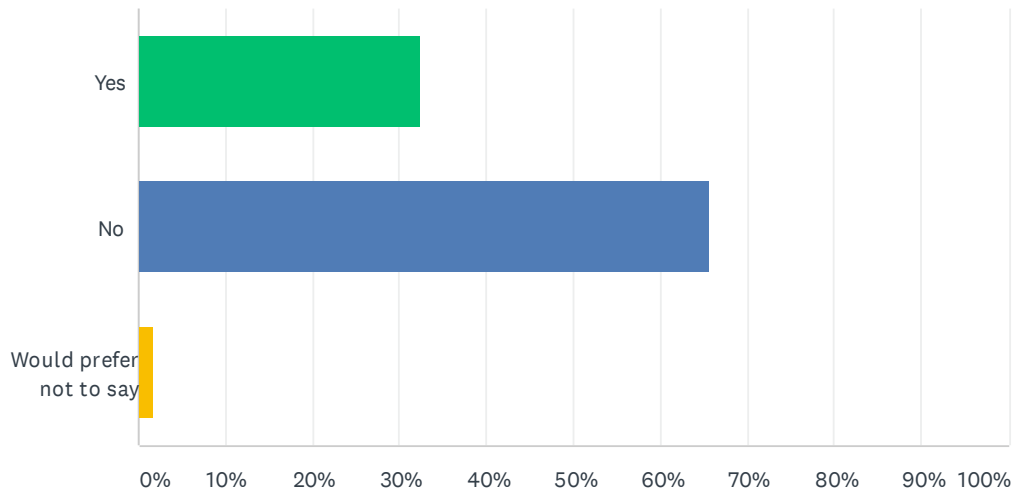

### Q37 Do you have childcare responsibilities which would make it difficult for you to return to classroom teaching?

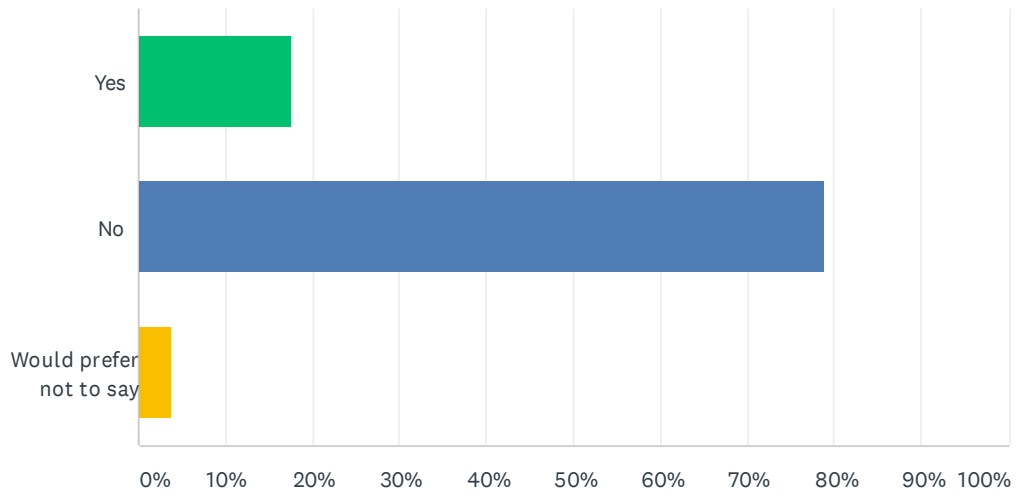

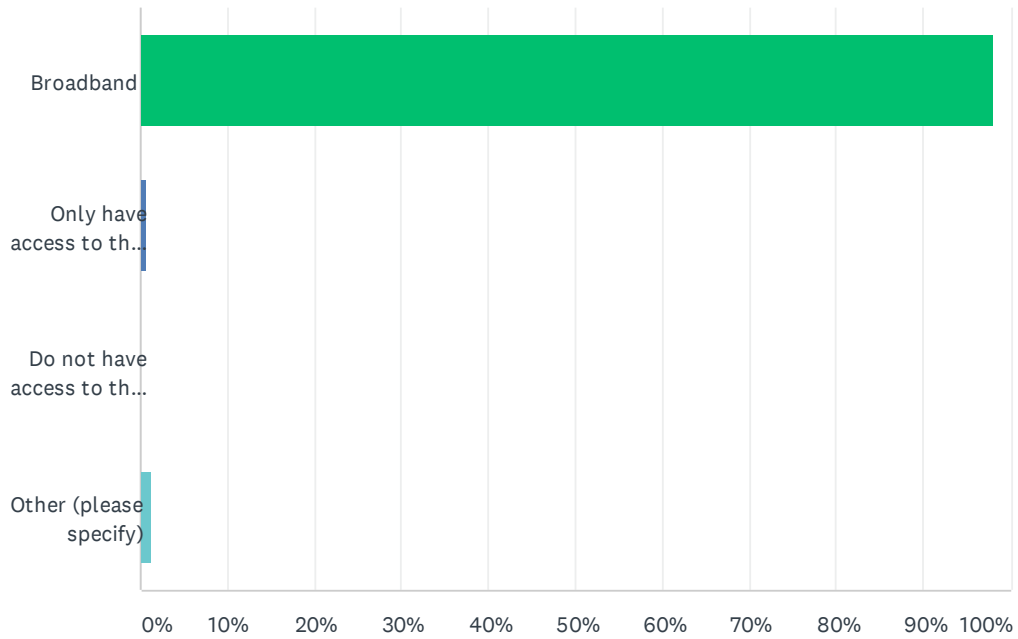

## Q40 What type of internet access do you have at home?

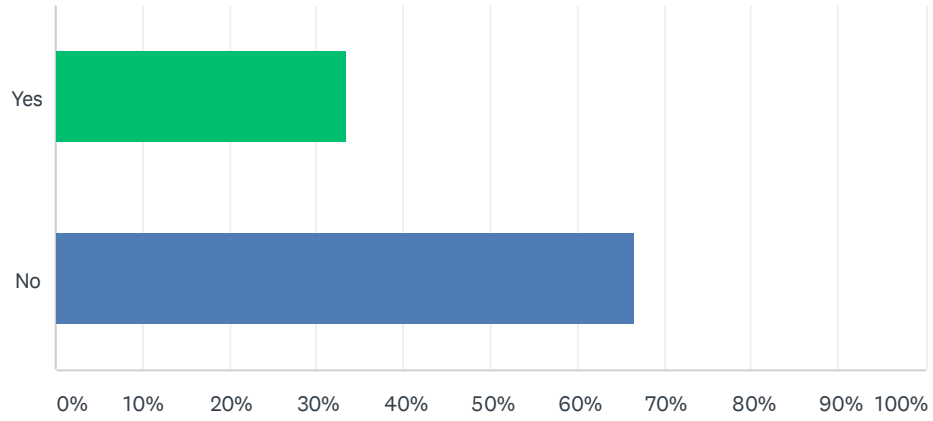
